

CALL Numbers

Call Numbers are the numbers printed on the spines of library books. The numbers decide where the books are to be found on the library shelves. The Library of Congress numbers used by the Library are composed of letters and numbers. The top line consists of one, two and sometimes three letters. The top line indicates the main subject or classification. The numbers next to the letters are for the special aspect of the book. The next line is the code for the author or title of the book and is a decimal number. An additional line is used to indicate date or volume. When you are searching for a book make sure that you write down the entire call number.

F598 Author's Name (first letter)
"Cutter Number" 598 is assigned so the book will shelve alphabetically by author with other books on the same subject. Think also of a book on the same subject with another author who's name starts with the letter "F"
